Immunization Records

If you are new to CCCS, you received a request for your child's immunization records. Please be sure that we have your child's records and birth certificate. The deadline for these documents is September 15. Any student who does not have these items on file by that date will not be permitted to return to school until we do have them.

Lunches must be ordered on-line. Log in to your Family Portal, and click on the Student tab. Choose Lunch. Select the items you want. Go to the bottom of the page and be sure to click on "Order Items" This will take you to the payment screen where you enter your payment information. To see if your order has been confirmed, check the lunch calendar for the ordering period. If your order was completed, your items will appear in **blue**. Uncompleted orders will appear in **red**. Please call the office at 614.7974.8146 if you need assistance.

Ordering deadlines are **firm**—no late orders will be accepted. Opening and closing dates will be posted in each issue of the Angel Army News and on the CCCS Facebook page.

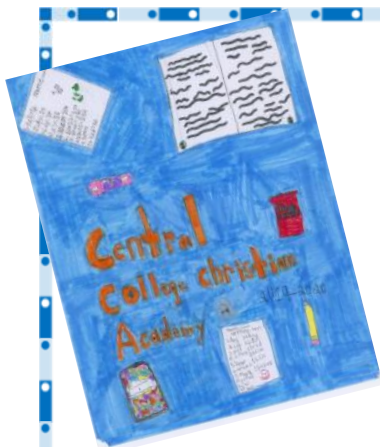

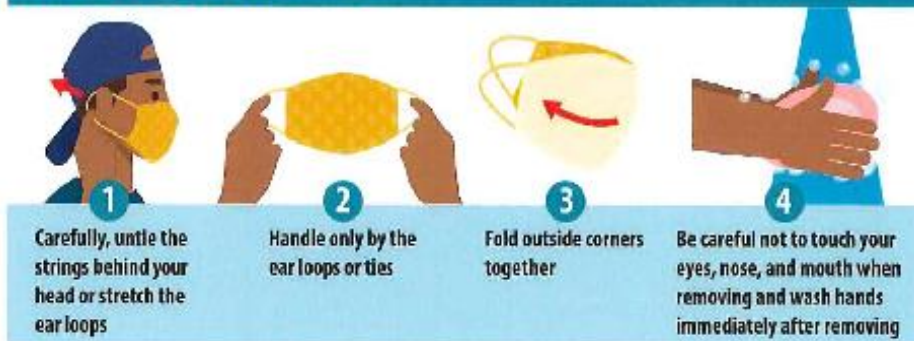
Mask Tips from the Columbus Department of Health (since we have to wear them anyway!)

How to Clean

Masks should be washed regularly. Always remove masks correctly and wash your hands after handling or touching a used mask.

- Include your mask with your regular laundry
- Use regular laundry detergent and the warmest appropriate water setting for the cloth used to make the mask
- Use the highest heat setting and leave in the dryer until completely dry
